#### **American Red Cross Offers Free Disaster Education Sessions Across Cape Cod**

Hyannis, MA, May 14, 2010 – To prepare for the upcoming Hurricane season, the Cape Cod and Islands Chapter of the American Red Cross has scheduled several free community sessions to provide local residents with important information on preparing for storms. The presentation will focus on disaster preparedness as well as provide special information for people with disabilities and how to build a disaster kit. Sessions typically last half an hour to one hour with questions welcome about the American Red Cross, AmeriCorps and Disaster preparedness. Registration is not necessary. All sessions are open to the public, free of charge.

Since Hurricane Katrina, the American Red Cross has worked diligently to better prepare our communities for a disaster.
